NOTICE OF QUESTIONS

(FOR ORAL ANSWER ON WEDNESDAY 12TH AUGUST, 2026)

1. **MR. O. KWAPA, MP. (JWANENG-MABUTSANE):** To ask the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to state the plans in place to ensure that the following roads are maintained as they have been damaged by rain and have not been maintained for a long time: (581)
 - (i) Jwaneng-Maokane;
 - (ii) Tsonyane-Lefoko;
 - (iii) Mokhomma Junction-Samane;
 - (iv) Mokhomma-Thankane;
 - (v) Kanaku-Mabutsane;
 - (vi) Mahotshwane-Sekoma; and
 - (vii) Mahotshwane-Trans Kalahari.
2. **MR. K. S. GARE, MP. (MOSHUPA-MANYANA):** To ask the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to state: (582)
 - (i) immediate and/or short-term measures the Ministry intends to undertake to make the Moshupa-Tshwaane-Ralekgetho-Pitseng road usable and safe for motorists and other road users; and
 - (ii) whether he is aware that this route is of significant economic importance as it provides access to key agricultural and production areas; and if so, what plans are in place to improve and maintain the road to support economic activities in the area.
3. **MR. J. T. MODISE, MP. (KGALAGADI SOUTH):** To ask the Minister of Environment and Tourism if he will consider allocating campsites in national parks and game reserves to local trusts as a source of economic activity to raise funds for their communities through trusts. (583)

4. **MR. G. KEKGONEGILE, MP. (MAUN EAST):** To ask the Minister of Water and Human Settlement to brief this Honourable House on the progress made in the Maun Green City project, with emphasis on: (584)
- (i) the model of investment and reasons thereof;
 - (ii) commencement and completion date of the project;
 - (iii) total area to be utilised, number of ploughing fields to be acquired and progress made in the acquisition;
 - (iv) compensation rates and whether the ploughing fields which will be acquired will be compensated at uniform rates; if not, why;
 - (v) total number of jobs to be created in the medium and long-term; and
 - (vi) the percentage of non-skilled and semi-skilled jobs to be allocated to District locals; and if none, why.
5. **MR. G. LEKAU, MP. (MOGODITSHANE WEST):** To ask the Minister of Local Government and Traditional Affairs to state: (585)
- (i) the number of Headmen of Record at Mogoditshane as compared to Gabane and Mmokolodi respectively; and
 - (ii) whether there are any vacancies at Mogoditshane and plans, if any, to fill them.
6. **MR. T. B. LUCAS, MP. (BOBIRWA):** To ask the Minister of Lands and Agriculture to state if there are any plans to review the dispensation of allocating church plots given the high demand of such in the country. (586)
7. **MR. M. M. PULE, MP. (KGATLENG EAST):** To ask the Minister of Transport and Infrastructure to state: (587)
- (i) the exact procurement status of the Mmamashia-Modipane Road project, clarifying if the tender for the 15-month asphalt overlay works has been awarded to date;
 - (ii) the comprehensive legal and structural steps being taken to clear the ongoing litigation standstills affecting the adjacent Modipane-Mabalane Road which continue to severely disadvantage local residents and businesses; and
 - (iii) the transitional maintenance strategies in place to address severe potholes and erosion along these two (2) corridors to ensure commuter safety ahead of full projects' delivery.

8. **MR. M. MOALOSI, MP. (NKANGE):** To ask the Minister of Child Welfare and Basic Education to state: (588)
- (i) the last time the Syllabus for Computer Studies at BGSE and Junior Certificate (JC) level was revised;
 - (ii) if she is aware that JC Computer Awareness subject is managed by 90% non-IT teachers despite a lot of trained IT teachers having been hired over the years;
 - (iii) the number of non-IT teachers who are heading/supervising IT teachers at senior schools compared to fully trained IT teachers; and
 - (iv) if she will consider revising the existing Computer Studies Policy to create dedicated Principal Education Officer posts and have merit-based computer science/computer awareness D4 promotions.
9. **MR. A. K. KHAN, MP. (MOLEPOLOLE NORTH):** To ask the Minister of Trade and Entrepreneurship: (589)
- (i) why several State-Owned Enterprises continue to procure System Applications and Products (SAP) support services from foreign-owned SAP partners, despite Government's commitment to citizen economic empowerment and the reservation of certain ICT services for citizen-owned enterprises; and
 - (ii) what measures Government is implementing to build the capacity of citizen-owned ICT firms to participate meaningfully in this sector.
10. **DR. K. GOBOTSWANG, MP. (TSWAPONG SOUTH):** To ask the Minister of Local Government and Traditional Affairs to apprise this Honourable House on the state of *Bogosi* and to state: (590)
- (i) whether the conditions under which traditional leaders operate are in keeping with their status, in respect of office furniture, ablutions and staffing; and
 - (ii) plans in place to improve the working environment of traditional leaders with clear timelines.
11. **MR. T. FURNITURE, MP. (TATI EAST):** To ask the Minister of Local Government and Traditional Affairs whether his Ministry has paid all eligible officers' sitting allowances for serving in the Adjudication Committee meetings in compliance with the Ombudsman's ruling dated 7th October, 2024; and if not, to state: (591)

- (i) the reasons for the delay in effecting the payments; and
 - (ii) whether there are plans to settle the outstanding arrears; and if so, when the affected officers can expect payment.
12. **MR. S. O. MAPULANGA, MP. (CHOBE):** To ask the Minister of Water and Human Settlement to update this Honourable House on the progress of the Unzovu Project; and further state: (592)
- (i) the initial completion dates and the progress against financial claims; and
 - (ii) how his Ministry intends to fast track the project delivery and action taken so far.
