THEME: SUBSIDY PROGRAMMES

To ask the Minister of Finance to specify/disclose/share the total number of subsidy programmes implemented by the Government of Botswana (GOB) by sector or at best by Ministry; and further state:

- (i) the total cost of each programme to the Government coffers during the last four (4) financial/fiscal years as both an absolute amount and a proportion of total revenues in each financial year;
- (ii) if GOB has an overall assessment criteria for the approval of these subsidy programmes and to share it if any exists;
- (iii) which one of these subsidy programmes has been the most successful as per the set criteria and objectives; and
- (iv) whether the level and penetration of subsidies in any economy reflects its underdevelopment.

- (vii) to state how many brigades and technical colleges in Botswana and what their carrying capacity per institution;
- (viii) the number of students enrolled from 2018 to date;
- (ix) whether he is aware that brigades and technical colleges students are suffering because of high costs of living; and
- (x) to state if the P300.00 allowance is enough to cater for their basic necessities.

AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ACT

20. "That this Honourable House requests Government to consider amending the Public Holidays Act so that it reads "if a public holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the Monday becomes a public holiday" as opposed to reading "if the public holidays listed fall on a Sunday then the Monday shall be a public holiday" as it has now become common that if a holiday falls on a Saturday then the next Monday is declared a public holiday at short notice and this disrupts planning and is bad for business."
