- 1. MR. J. J. FRENZEL, MP. (SHASHE WEST): To ask the Minister of Lands and (480) Agriculture to state:
 - (i) the number of plots reserved for churches and businesses in Shashe West villages;
 - (ii) what delays the allocation of residential plots in Mathangwane as ploughing fields have long been repossessed by the land board; and
 - (iii) when the remaining residential and business plots in Natale will be allocated pending part allocation that was done in March-April 2023.
- 2. MR. P. AARON, MP. (NGAMI): To ask the Minister of Lands and (482) Agriculture to state:
 - (i) if he is aware that people of Ngami have been turned into destitutes as a result of their livestock being killed due to the outbreak of cattle disease:
 - (ii) whether cattle from Qangwa, Xaixai and Dobe areas are killed despite having not crossed any fence and with very little or no compensation;
 - (iii) if he is aware that Namibian cattle that have crossed into Botswana are not killed but instead are allowed to go back to Namibia, if so, why are they allowed to freely return to Namibia;
 - (iv) if the exact same thing is happening on the eastern side, with cattle farmers from Tubu all the way to Habu losing huge heads of cattle:
 - if buffalos which are believed to be carriers of Foot and Mouth disease when found on the cattle side are not killed but are driven back using BDF helicopters; and

- (vi) if he is aware that the area from Makalamabedi to Godigwa has suffered the greatest loss in cattle population than any other area in Botswana due to negligence associated with how the outbreak of cattle disease is dealt with.
- 3. MR. M. M. MOROLONG, MP. (KGATLENG CENTRAL): To ask the Minister of (483) Transport and Infrastructure to state:
 - (i) if there are plans to establish a Railway Training School in the near future;
 - (ii) costs incurred by Botswana Railways on maintenance services of their locomotive engines and wagons for the past 10 years; and
 - (iii) why the wagon maintenance services are sourced out of the country.
- 4. MR. K. S. GARE, MP. (MOSHUPA-MANYANA): To ask the Minister of Water (484) and Human Settlement to state:
 - (i) if he is aware that there is water shortage in Ntlhantlhe, Letlhakane West, Manyana as well as Sesung; and
 - (ii) plans bring a permanent solution to address this and the timeline for this to be done.
- 5. MR. R. M. LEKUTLANE, MP. (KGALAGADI NORTH): To ask Minister of Lands (485) and Agriculture to state:
 - the initial start and completion date and cost of the Multi Species abattoir and if there are any revised costs and completion dates;
 - (ii) whether the project is running as planned, if not, what was the course of delays and any mitigation in place; and
 - (iii) whether, during the feasibility studies prior to the construction of the abattoir, Kgalagadi North farmers were factored in as suppliers to the abattoir, if so, how are the Kgalagadi North farmers expected to reach Tsabong, given that Tsabong - Lekgwabe/Tshane road is heavy sand and infested with predators lions to be specific, especially as via Sekoma is not economical.

- 6. MR. T. BOGATSU, MP. (LENTSWELETAU-LEPHEPHE): To ask the Minister of Child Welfare and Basic Education if she is aware of the Government Savigram dated 13th October, 2022, that made reference to a prior Circular Savingram DP4/75/8 XI dated 6th May 2022, which instructed that Officers who were on study leave prior to the coming into effect of Public Service Management Directive No.8 of 2014, which introduced full salary while on training, are entitled to half of their salary arrears for such period; if so:
 - (i) the affected teachers have not yet been paid; and
 - (ii) would the Minister pay the owed teachers their accrued half salary arrears.
- 7. MR. R. W. KAIZER, MP. (SELEBI PHIKWE WEST): To ask the Minister of Child Welfare and Basic Education if she is aware of part time adult educators who were employed at Lapologang Primary School in Selebi Phikwe who were relieved from their jobs without notice; if so, to state:
 - the number of part time adult educators who lost their jobs in 2012;
 - (ii) whether the said adult educators were paid their terminal benefits, if so, how much was disbursed and how many of them got paid;
 - (iii) for those who were not paid, if any, what are the challenges and when will they be paid; and
 - (iv) if the Government will consider reemploying them since they were unfairly dismissed from their posts.
- 8. MR. V. B. PHOLOGOLO, MP. (KANYE WEST): To ask the Minister of Lands and Agriculture whether he is aware that some long time and former employees of Botswana Meat Commission were coerced and or tricked to opt for voluntary early retirement sometime in January 2016 at a time when retrenchment exercise negotiations were ongoing between the management and the union, Botswana Meat Industry Workers Union and that those tricked for voluntary exit walked away with way less a package that one received by the involuntarily retrenched; if so, to apprise this Honourable House on the grievances those former employees registered with their former employer and the resultant outcome. In the event the outcome was adverse, is the employer amenable to a reengagement.

- 9. MR. L. LESEDI, MP. (SEROWE SOUTH): To ask the Minister of Lands and (489) Agriculture to state:
 - (i) reasons for the delay in the allocation of residential plots in Serowe whereas plenty of land is available for allocation;
 - (ii) when the Ngwato land board last allocated a plot in Serowe and why there has been no allocation for such a very long period of time; and
 - (iii) when Ngwato land board will resume and open plots for allocation as residents have waited for many years to be allocated plots.
- 10. MR. P. M. MOSANANA, MP. (KANYE EAST): To ask the Minister of Lands and (490) Agriculture to state:
 - (i) when the Service Centre in Mmathethe was completed;
 - (ii) when this facility is going to start operation;
 - (iii) how much money is used monthly to pay people manning the place; and
 - (iv) how much has been spent on the project to completion.
- 11. MR. P. K. MOTAOSANE, MP. (THAMAGA-KUMAKWANE): To ask the Minister (491) of Lands and Agriculture to state:
 - (i) the number of farms owned by Government;
 - (ii) if all the farms are all in use; if so, whether they are all used to full capacity; and
 - (iii) whether Government will consider leasing those farms to farmers in communal areas.
- 12. DR. K. GOBOTSWANG, MP. (TSWAPONG SOUTH): To ask the Minister of (183) Transport and Infrastructure to state:
 - (i) the total number of public projects that Joe Electrical is involved in;
 - (ii) the said projects;
 - (iii) the total value in relation to each component;
 - (iv) the projects where Joe Electrical has benefited via direct appointment; and

(v) whether there were no other qualified companies that could have benefited in the same way.
