4. "That this Honourable House requests Government to expedite the unbundling of Botswana Power Corporation (BPC) to allow privately-owned companies to connect electricity in homes and farms." (Mr. G. Lekau, MP. – Mogoditshane West) ***Adopted on 30/07/2026***

"That this Honourable House requests Government to encourage through policy framework or legislation, employee share schemes as a strategy to enhance employee engagement, retention and alignment of interest of employers and employees." ESTABLISHMENT OF A TASK FORCE TO INVESTIGATE THE EXTENT OF FOREIGN WORK PERMIT ABUSE AND NON-COMPLIANCE WITH CITIZEN SUBCONTRACTING MANDATES IN GOVERNMENT PROJECTS

6. "That this Honourable House requests Government to immediately establish a high-level Task Force mandated to investigate the extent of foreign work permit abuse and non-compliance with citizen subcontracting mandates in all Government projects, and further requests that the Task Force be required to submit a comprehensive report with actionable recommendations to this Honourable House within six (6) months of its formation." **GOVERNMENT TO COMMIT TO ALLOCATE PLOTS TO ALL PERSONS

9. “That this Honourable House requests Government to commit to allocate residential plots to all persons on waiting list for residential plots in next 3 years to facilitate home ownership for a significant proportion of the people of Botswana.” (Mr. T. 10. “That this Honourable House resolves to request Government to take the necessary steps to ratify and domesticate the SADC Model Law on Public Finance Management into the national Legal Framework.” (Mr. T. Furniture, MP. – Tati East) ***Motion withdrawn***

AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT

11. “That this Honourable House requests Government to amend the Public Health Act in order to give the Director of Health Services powers to undertake efforts to contain and control the outbreak and spread of any disease without the need for His Excellency the President to rule by decree in a protracted State of Emergency.” (Mr. L. Lesedi, MP. – Serowe South) ***Withdrawn by the Mover on 14/08/2026***

INTRODUCTION OF SIGN LANGUAGE AS AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE

12. “That this Honourable House resolves to introduce and adopt sign language as an official language in Botswana.” (Mr. M. M. Morolong, MP. – Kgatleng Central) ***Adopted on 17/08/2026***

**MOTION FOR THE ADJOURNMENT –
DEFINITE MATTER OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE**

13. “That this Honourable House requests Government to broaden the approach to the search and rescue of missing persons by establishing appropriate mechanisms through which families and communities may, where they so wish, engage traditional practitioners, spiritual leaders and other persons whom they believe may assist in locating missing persons, in coordination with and subject to the oversight of the Botswana Police Service.” (Ms. H. P. Manyeneng, MP. – Mmopane-Metsimotlhabe) ***Adopted on 21/08/2026***

ESTABLISHMENT OF A SPECIAL FUND FOR GENDER BASED VIOLENCE (GBV)

14. “That this Honourable House requests Government to strengthen Botswana’s commitment to gender equality and the protection of its citizens by establishing a Special Fund for Gender Based Violence (GBV) to provide immediate, targeted financial resources for prevention, survivor support and legal redress.” (Mr. T. Furniture, MP. – Tati East) ***Negated on 21/08/2026***

**FORMAL DOCUMENTATION AND REGISTRATION OF IMMIGRANTS WITH A VIEW
TO ESTABLISH THE NUMBER AND THEIR SOCIO AND ECONOMIC IMPACTS**

15. "That this Honourable House resolves that Government establish and implement a Formal Documentation and Registration of all Immigrants including illegal or undocumented immigrants with a view to establish their number and their socio and economic impacts on local citizen and community resources and services." (Mr. L. Barongwang, MP. – Mogoditshane East)

**AMENDMENT OF BUSINESS REGULATIONS AND COMPLIANCE AT COMPANIES
AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AUTHORITY (CIPA)**

16. "That this Honourable House requests Government to consider exempting registered non-operating businesses or shelf companies from filing fees or paying annual returns as well as to reduce filing fees for annual returns of operating business entities, restoration fees for businesses and companies deactivated and removed from the CIPA register." (Mr. C. K. Jacobs, MP. – Lobatse)

GOVERNMENT TO REVIEW THE POLICY OF DISPOSSESSING LAND-HOLDERS

17. "That this Honourable House requests Government to review the policy of dispossessing land-holders to give way to village expansions, with a view to allowing the existence of small farms within towns and villages." (Dr. U. Dow, MP. – Kgatleng West)

**ESTABLISHMENT OF A SPECIAL PARLIAMENTARY SELECT COMMITTEE
TO INVESTIGATE THE GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT
OF BULLS AND HEIFERS AS WELL AS DAIRY GOATS**

18. "That this Honourable House resolves to establish a Special Parliamentary Select Committee to investigate the Government procurement of bulls and heifers from Texas in the United States of America as well as heifers and dairy goats from Australia." (Dr. K. Gobotswang, MP. – Tswapong South)

**REINSTATEMENT OF CORPORAL PUNISHMENT IN SCHOOLS
AS A REGULATED DISCIPLINARY MEASURE**

19. "That this Honourable House requests Government to reinstate corporal punishment in schools as a regulated disciplinary measure to strengthen discipline, promote respect for authority, and create a safe and conducive learning environment." (Mr. A. K. Khan, MP. – Molepolole North) *Withdrawn*

**REVIEW OF THE PUBLIC PROCUREMENT ACT FRAMEWORK TO STRENGTHEN
AND INSTITUTIONALISE A HYBRID FORCE ACCOUNT MODEL FOR
PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE DELIVERY**

20. "That this Honourable House requests Government to review the Public Procurement Act and related regulatory frameworks with a view to strengthening and institutionalising a Hybrid Force Account Model for public infrastructure delivery, under which Government shall strategically utilise its existing internal engineering personnel, plant and equipment for the execution of routine road construction, rehabilitation, emergency works and maintenance; and further that the model shall prioritise the optimal use of existing State capacity in order to improve efficiency, reduce infrastructure delivery costs, enhance responsiveness to service delivery needs and contribute to fiscal consolidation, while reserving competitive tendering for highly specialised, complex and large-scale components of public infrastructure projects that require private sector expertise." (Mr. M. M. Pule, MP. – Kgatleng East)

GOVERNMENT TO CONFISCATE ALL TRUCKS USED IN ILLEGAL SAND MINING

21. "That this Honourable House requests Government to confiscate all trucks used in illegal sand mining upon the conviction of the offenders and that the proceeds from the forfeiture of such vehicles be allocated to the respective Village Development Committees." (Ms. H. P. Manyeneng, MP. – Mmopane-Metsimotlhabe)

**DEVELOPMENT OF A COMPREHENSIVE POLICY AND LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK
FOR EARLY ACCESS TO A PORTION OF PENSION AND RETIREMENT
SAVINGS BY GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES**

22. "That this Honourable House requests Government to consider developing a comprehensive policy and legislative framework permitting government employees to access a prescribed portion of their accumulated pension funds." (Mr. J. J. Frenzel, MP. – Shashe West)

ESTABLISHMENT OF A HUMAN-WILDLIFE VICTIM FUND

23. "That this Honourable House resolves that Government establishes a Human-Wildlife Victim Fund to provide timely and adequate financial assistance, compensation, rehabilitation, and livelihood support to individuals, families, and communities affected by human-wildlife conflict." (Mr. G. Disho, MP. – Okavango East)

**REVIEW AND UPWARD ADJUSTMENT OF THE COMPENSATION RATES
FOR LOSS OF LIFE, INJURY, LIVESTOCK AND CROPS**

24. "That this Honourable House resolves that Government immediately reviews and upwardly adjust the compensation rates which no longer reflect the true market value for loss of life, injury, livestock and crops, for the purposes of aligning them, with current market prices and inflation in order to promote the coexistence between the people of Botswana and wildlife." (Mr. C. K. Hikuama, MP. – Maun West)

**CITIZEN ENTREPRENEURIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CEDA)
TO DISCONTINUE THE ISSUANCE OF LOANS**

25. "That this Honourable House requests Government to discontinue the issuance of loans by the Citizen Entrepreneurial Development Agency (CEDA) and instead partner with commercial banks for all credit facilities by providing surety." (Mr. G. Lekau, MP. – Mogoditshane West)

AMENDMENT OF THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ACT

26. "That this Honourable House requests Government to consider amending the Public Holidays Act so that it reads, "if a public holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the Monday becomes a public holiday" as opposed to reading, "if the public holidays listed fall on a Sunday then the Monday shall be a public holiday" as it has now become common that if a holiday falls on a Saturday then the next Monday is declared a public holiday at short notice and this disrupts planning and is bad for business." (Mr. L. Lesedi, MP. – Serowe South)

CREATION OF SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONES IN THE GREATER GABORONE

27. "That this Honourable House requests Government to expand the creation of special economic zones in the greater Gaborone and other areas such as Molepolole to create an entrepreneurial ecosystem through supporting and developing small, medium enterprises to manufacture and market natural resources in their areas for export as finished products to create employment opportunities and ensure inter-generational skills transfer." (Mr. A. K. Khan, MP. – Molepolole North)

**ESTABLISHMENT OF A STATUTORY FUND FOR NATIONAL
ECO-TOURISM AND LOCAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (LED) FUND**

28. "That this Honourable House requests Government to urgently establish a dedicated, Ring Fenced Statutory Fund for National Eco-Tourism and Local Economic Development (LED) called the Eco Tourism and Local Economic Development Fund to automatically finance community-led projects, heritage exhibitions, and regional agri-tourism initiatives such as the Dinokeng Fish Festival thereby systematically shifting these vital rural economic engines away from a state of structural insecurity and unreliable, ad-hoc annual ministerial handout." (Mr. M. M. Pule, MP. – Kgatleng East)

DECRIMINALISATION OF SEX WORK

29. "That this Honourable House resolves to request Government to decriminalise sex work by repealing section 155 (Living on the earnings of prostitution) and Section 156 (Keeping a brothel) of the Penal Code (Cap 08:01) in order to protect human rights, curb gender-based violence, and strengthen public health interventions." (Mr. G. Lekau, MP. – Mogoditshane West)

AMENDMENT OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

30. "That this Honourable House resolves to request Government to amend the Road Traffic Act Cap 69:01 and it's Regulations to reduce certain traffic fines to affordable levels in order to combat corruption and increase Government revenue." (Brigadier D. Mokgwathi, MP. – Letlhakeng)
